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PROGRAMS

FLEXIBLE PROGRAM OPTIONS

Griggs International Academy has a flexible system of education from Pre-Kindergarten (age 3) to High School (age 18). Griggs students may enroll for an entire grade or for individual subjects. This enables our education programs to be adaptable to benefit one student or an entire school. The diverse range of schools that currently offer Griggs educational programs shows that there is no requirement to adopt a standardized approach. Indeed, the challenge in implementing a program is to ensure the program fits the unique school context, preserving the school's identity and characteristics.

Some schools choose to introduce the Griggs Top Up Program as a twin track system, which supplements the local, national or other international programs and qualifications. Other schools offer the Griggs educational programs in their full operation, or as a section within a school and fully adapt the Griggs philosophy and school practices.

TOP UP PROGRAM

In the Top Up Program, students continue to work on the local national curriculum, or curricula of other countries, while pursuing the Griggs diploma at the same time. The student's previous and current coursework is compared to the Griggs' requirements in order to assess what Griggs courses need to be completed to receive the Griggs (American) high school diploma in addition to the one from the registered school that the student is attending. The student is required to take at least 6 units (credits) that are Griggs approved in order to gain the Griggs College Preparatory Diploma (or 5 units (credits) for the Griggs Standard Diploma). Schools choose this type of Top Up Program to help prepare students for attending an American university.

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DIPLOMA OPTIONS

COLLEGE PREPARATORY DIPLOMA AND STANDARD DIPLOMA OPTIONS

Griggs International Academy is dedicated to providing excellent academic opportunities to extend educational and career pathways. Griggs provides two types of diplomas in which to attain preparation for these life goals.

College Preparatory Diploma. Provides the opportunity for students to broaden their educational foundation through the study of a modern language—a requirement for most four-year degree colleges—and increase academic rigor in math and science courses in preparation for college-level study as well as gaining a competitive edge in the workplace. This diploma requires at least 25.0 units of credit in specific areas of study. At least 6.0 credits must be completed with GIA, three (3) classes of which must be within the senior year.

Standard Diploma. Provides comprehensive curricular foundation for students seeking to prepare for higher education and achieve career goals requiring at least 21.0 units of credit in specific areas of study. At least 5.0 credits must be completed with GIA, two (2) classes of which must be within the senior year.

Each diploma is in alignment with the Middle States Accreditation standards as well as approved by the Maryland Board of Education. GIA will prepare a personalized plan of study that lists the units (courses) necessary to complete a College Preparatory or Standard diploma.

Standard High School Diploma Requirements: 21 units

- 4 units of English (must include one unit of American Literature)
- 3 units of math (must include Algebra I; if Pre-Algebra is completed, an additional math credit is required)
- 3 units of science (must include one life science)
- ½ unit of health
- 1 unit of physical education
- 3 units of social studies
- 1 unit applied arts
- 1 unit of fine arts
- 4¹/₂ unit of electives
- Minimum 20 hours per year of community service
- ACT/SAT test scores (recommended)

Electives are those courses that are taken in addition to the mandatory courses required by GIA. Schools can offer elective subjects that tailor their programs towards a specialist area such as STEM, Liberal Arts, Arts and Design or Ecological Entrepreneurship.



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CURRICULUM

The course content of each subject can be tailored according to the specialization of the teacher, who is able to extend the learning environment to meet the needs of the students. Griggs uses formative and summative assessment developed with our teachers internationally. This process invites creativity and ensures that our students flourish academically.

Students achieve credits towards the Griggs high school diploma over three or four years of study. This provides a sense of continuous purpose and direction in each subject. While other competitors only offer terminal exams - that leaves students with few options, Griggs continuously keeps its students aware of academic progress through our credit system. Students have the security of course completion and the assurance of university entry with Griggs. Griggs is also unique in offering summer and winter academic programs whereby students can earn credit to advance studies. Furthermore, one of our most unique and competitive advantages is the opportunity for high school students to take university credit delivered by Andrews University. Many universities in the US accept these credits.

UNIVERSITY RECOGNITION

The US high school diploma offered by Griggs International Academy is accepted by over 150 countries worldwide. Our programs ensure graduates are accepted into universities in the most popular countries for Chinese students including the US, Canada, the UK, Australia, New Zealand, and Singapore.

Statistics show 60% of GIA graduate students with the College Preparatory high school diploma have enrolled in the top 50 universities in the US, with 80% in the top 100 based on the affiliate records of university entries collected from 2014 to 2019.

Recent graduates were also accepted into both US and international universities including NYU, Pennsylvania State University, the University of the Arts London, UC San Diego, the University of Sydney, the University of Toronto, Yonsei University, South Korea, and the University of York.
